An Accidental Intracapsular Extraction

Clinical Image




Figure 1: Injuried eye.

A 24 year old man, without any medical history, was the victim of a globe injury of the right eye by a fall on a door handle (Figure 1).

The ophthalmologic examination revealed in the traumatized eye, a negative luminous perception, a diffuse subconjunctival hemorrhage, a paralimbic corneal wound ranging from 12 h to 4 h in the manner of a keratotomy, a nasal scleral wound, an externalization of the lens and a hyphema stage 4. The fundus was inaccessible. We washed the anterior chamber and sutured the two wounds.
